Thursday, February 18, 1937.

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Mr. Findlen from the Committee on Agriculture reported ought to pass on bill an act relating to the apportioning of State aid to agricultural societies (H. P. No. 848) (L. D. No. 300)

Report read and accepted, and the bill having already been printed was read twice under suspension of the rules and tomorrow assigned.

First Reading of a Printed Bill (H. P. 1611) (L. D. 649) An act creating a Board of Education for the city of Lewiston.

On motion by Mr. Forgue of Lewiston, the rules were suspended and the bill was given its third reading, passed to be engrossed and sent up for concurrence.

#### Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Higgins of Ellsworth, it was voted to take from the table the ninth unassigned matter, bill an act changing the name of Oak Grove Seminary to Oak Grove School, S. P. 68, L. D. 285, tabled by that gentleman on February 16th pending third reading.
Thereupon, Mr. Higgins offered House Amendment A and moved its

adoption, as follows:

House Amendment A to Senate Paper 68, Legislative Document 285, bill an act changing the name of Oak Grove Seminary to Oak Grove School.

Amend said bill by striking out the period at the end thereof and adding thereto the following: 'and on and after the effective date of this act the name of Oak Grove Seminary is changed to Oak Grove School.

Thereupon, House Amendment A was adopted and the bill as amended by House Amendment A had its third reading and was passed to be engrossed in non-concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Woodbury of Morrill, it was voted to take from the table the eighth unassigned matter, bill an act relating to growers' and packers' contracts, H. P. 1547, L. D. 557, tabled by that gentleman on February 16th pending reference to a committee; and on further motion by the same gentleman the bill was referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

On motion by Mr. Mack of East Millinocket, it was voted to take from the table the first unassigned matter, resolve in favor of the Townships of Township 1, Range 9, Township 2, Range 9, Township 2, Range 10, and Township 3, Range 10, Piscataquis County, H. P. 926, tabled by that gentleman on February 9th pending reference to a committee; and on further motion by the same gentleman the resolve was referred to the committee on Ways and Bridges, 500 copies ordered printed, and sent up for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Ellis of Rangeley, it was voted to take from the table the tenth unassigned matter, order relative to biennial report of the Public Utilities Commission, tabled by that gentleman on February 16th pending passage.

Mr. ELLIS: Mr. Speaker, as we now have on our desks the report that this order requires, I move that the order be indefinitely postponed.

The motion prevailed and the order was indefinitely postponed.

On motion by Mr. Pike of Bridgton, it was voted to take from the

table the third unassigned matter, bill an act relating to the recording of deeds, H. P. 1289, L. D. 468, tabled by that gentleman on February 11th pending reference to a committee; and on further motion by the same gentleman the bill was referred to the committee on Judiciary and sent up for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Pike of Bridgton, it was voted to take from the table the fifth unassigned matter, bill an act relating to punishment for certain offenses, H. P. 1436, L. D. 555, tabled by that gentleman on February 16th pending reference to a committee; and on further motion by the same gentleman the bili was referred to the committee on Legal Affairs and sent up for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Pike of Bridgton, it was voted to take from the table the sixth unassigned matter, bill an act relating to the civil jurisdiction of Municipal Courts, H. P. 1437, L. D. 556, tabled by that gentleman on February 16th pending reference to a committee; and on further motion by the same gentleman the bill was referred to the committee on Legal Affairs and sent up for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Haskell of Lee, Adjourned until ten o'clock tomorrow morning.
