Orders of the Day

On motion by Mr. Noyes of Franklin, the House voted to reconsider its action taken at last Friday's

session whereby H. P. 1650, L. D. 785, bill an act levying a tax on malt beverages to provide revenue for the 1936-1937 deficiency account, was recommitted to the committee on Taxation; and on further motion by the same gentleman the bill was indefinitely postponed.

On motion by Mr. Brown of Bangor, it was voted to take from the table the twelfth unassigned matter, House report of the committee on Judiciary on bill an act relating to over-night parking of trailers, autohomes and house-cars, H. P. 1441, L. D. 582, reporting that same be referred to the committee on Public Health, tabled by that gentleman on February 26th pending accep-tance of the report; and on further motion by the same gentleman the report was accepted.
