the bill read once and Tuesday next assigned for second reading.

Mr. Goudy from the Committee on Legal Affairs, on "An Act Desig-nating Columbus Day a Legal Holiday" (S. P. 50) (L. D. 14) reported that the same ought to pass.

(On motion by Miss Laughlin of Cumberland the report was laid

upon the table pending acceptance of the report).

Mr. WORTHEN of Penobscot: Mr. President, I wish to ask at this time the unanimous consent of the Senate to introduce, out of order, a resolve relative to flood disaster.

Unanimous consent was granted that Senator to present, out of order and under suspension of the rules, "Resolve Relative to Flood Disaster" (S. P. 147):

"RESOLVED: By the Legislature of the State of Maine:

"WHEREAS, we recognize the perils of your situation, and that you are confronted with a most girevous disaster caused by flood conditions most devastating; and

"WHEREAS, the State of Maine has recently experienced a similar disaster and fully appreciates the gravity of your situation;

"BE IT RESOLVED hereby that the Legislature of the State of Maine extends to you and your people our heartfelt sympathies, and offer to you and your people such assistance and aid as is within our power to offer, and await your call; and

"BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolve be transmitted by telegraph to each of the governors of the several states affected."

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Fernald of Waldo the resolve was laid upon the table pending consideration.

Orders of the Day

Mr. FERNALD of Waldo: Mr. President, earlier in today's session we referred Senate Paper 141, a re-solve in favor of Charles P. Davis of Sebec, to the Ways and Bridges. the Committee on

I believe that this is a matter which should properly go before the Committee on Claims because it is in regard to the killing of sheep and I therefore move at this time that the Senate reconsider its reference of this resolve to the Committee on Ways and Bridges.
