Thursday, February 18, 1937.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend Herbert E. P. Pressey of Augusta.

The Senate was called to order by the President.

On motion by Mr. Fernald of Waldo the Senate voted to take from the table, Resolve in Favor of Harry C. Libby of Portland (S. P. 63) (L. D. 43), tabled by that Senator early in today's session pending consideration.

Mr. FERNALD of Waldo: Mr. President, I now move the adoption of House Amendment A which simply strikes off the preamble of the bill but does not change the intent or meaning of the bill whatsoever.

Thereupon, the Senate voted to reconsider its former action whereby the resolve was passed to be engrossed, House Amendment A was read and adopted in concurrence and the resolve as amended by House Amendment A was passed to be engrossed in concurrence.
