SENATE

Tuesday, February 23, 1937.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend William R. Wood of Augusta.

Journal of Friday, February 19th, 1937, read and approved.

Mr. FERNALD of Waldo: Mr. President, out of order and under suspension of the rules, on behalf of the Senator from Cumberland, Senator Willey, and myself, I ask unanimous consent of the Senate that we be excused from our official duties for one week.

Unanimous consent was granted.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

From the House:

Bill "An Act to Protect the Right of Employees to Organize and Bargain Collectively; and Creating a Labor Relations Board." (H. P. 1293) (L. D. 488)

(In the Senate on February 18th, referred to the Committee on Labor in non-concurrence.)

Comes from the House, that body having adhered to its former action whereby the bill was referred to the Committee on Legal Affairs.

In the Senate, on motion by Miss Martin of Penobscot, that body voted to recede and concur with the House in the reference of the bill to the Committee on Legal Affairs.

On motion by Mr. Marden of Kennebec, the Senate voted to take from the table, An Act Relating to the Charter of the City of Waterville (S. P. 249) tabled by that Senator on February 9th pending reference; and on further motion by the same Senator the bill was referred to the Committee on Legal Affairs and 1500 copies ordered printed.
