On motion by Mr. Goudy of Cumberland, the Senate voted to take from the table, Resolve to Regulate Fishing in Sebago Lake in the County of Cumberland (H. P. 74) (L. D. 30) tabled by that Senato earlier in today's session pending final passage.

MR. GOUDY of Cumberland: Mr. President, I now move that this resolve be indefinitely postponed. I want to applogize to the Senate at this time for not taking notice of this bill before but not being a fresh this bill before, but not being a fresh water fisherman myself I was therefore not interested in those particular matters, but I have heard from home recently in no uncertain manner and there have been resolves unanimously passed by the Fish and Game Association in my county and they have asked me to strenuously oppose the passage of this resolve as being unnecessary and unfair. This resolve places a daily limit allowed to any one fisherman of three fish. Now, I imagine that probably fresh water fish are somewhat like salt water fish in that they differ in size sometimes. Three fish some-times might be three little fish they could not keep or, for some reason, could not use. As I say, I am simply voicing the sentiment of the Fish and Game Association in my county, which is a very large body, and I ask, in their behalf, that this resolve be indefinitely postponed.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Worthen of Penobscot, the resolve was laid upon the table pending the motion to indefinitely postpone.
