"To the Honorable Senate.

"Greetings:

"The sovereign citizens of the town of Mount Vernon, in town meeting assembled, memorialize you to relieve the property tax by amending the General Highway Act to the effect that all charges for snow removal and maintenance of state highway, state aid and third class and Special Resolve are abolished; further to amend the act so that the excise tax on automobiles, trailers and trucks is segregated and available only for use on town ways.
"Given this first day of March in

the year of our Lord one thousand, nine hundred and thirty-seven.

Thereupon, on motion by the same Senator, the memorial was referred to the Committee on Ways and Bridges.
