Monday, March 29, 1937.

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Cymbrid Hughes of Augusta.

Journal of Friday, March 26th, read and approved.

"Senate Amendment A to Legislative Document 170. Section Amend Section 1 of said bill by inserting after the word 'certified' in Line Nine, the words 'after examination.' Section 2. Amend Section 4 of said bill by inserting under 'B' the following: 'B-1.'"

Miss Laughlin: Mr. President, on this amendment I would like to say that the first change, inserting the words "after examination", is to provide for certification by a physician only after an examination. The other is simply a typographical error. These amendments are offered rather than to make a redraft of the bill, so I move the adoption of Senate Amendment A.

Thereupon, Senate Amendment A was adopted and the bill as amended by Senate Amendment A was given its first reading and tomorrow as-

signed for second reading.

MARDEN of Kennebec: Mr. President, I wish to present Senate Amendment A to Legislative Document 658 and move its adoption. For information, this amendment adds a penalty to the section which, by inadvertance, was omitted by the committee.

"Senate Amendment A. Legislative Document 658 is hereby amended by adding thereto the following: Whoever violates the provisions thereof shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars or by imprisonment for a term of not more than eleven months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.'
