On motion by Mr. Pike of Bridgton, it was voted to take from the table the fourth unassigned matter, bill an act to permit the use of Great Ponds for certain purposes, H. P. 7, tabled by that gentleman on January 11th pending reference; and on further motion by the same gentleman the bill was referred to the committee on Interior Waters, 1,000 copies ordered printed, and sent up for concurrence.
