all applicants who have filed application for old age assistance and whose applications have not been allowed, approved or denied, ar-ranged by towns. And be it further

ORDERED, that the Clerk of the House be directed to make available the information received in accordance with the foregoing to members of the Legislature only for use in the discharge of their official duties.
