Monday, April 3, 1939.

The House met according to adjournment and was called to order by the Speaker.

Prayer by the Rev. Mr. Stiles of Hallowell.

Journal of the previous session read and approved.

Papers from the Senate disposed of in concurrence.

Senate Bills in First Reading

Bill "An Act relative to Hunting and Fishing Licenses; Revocation of" (S. P. 25) (L. D. 11); in new draft (S. P. 574) (L. D. 1106)

Bill "An Act relative to Damage by Deer to Growing Crops and Or-chards" (S. P. 179) (L. D. 230)

Bill "An Act relating to Beauty Culture" (S. P. 144) (L. D. 129)

From the Senate: Bill "An Act relating to Emergency Aid in Certain Organized and Unorganized Territory" (S. P. 558) (L. D. 1083) which was passed to be engrossed in the House on March 30th as amended by House Amendment

Comes from the Senate, recommitted to the Committee on Legal Affairs in non-concurrence.

In the House: On motion by Mr. Burgess of Limestone, the House voted to recede from its former action whereby it passed this bill to be engrossed as amended by House Amendment "A". The House then voted to concur with the Senate in the recommitment of the bill to the Committee on Legal Affairs.

From the Senate: Bill "An Act relating to Regulation of Pauper Expense for Conveyance of Children Attending the Public Schools" (H. P. 1751) (L. D. 900)

Comes from the Senate, passed to be engrossed as amended by Senate Amendment "A" in non-concurrence.

In the House: Senate Amendment

"A" read by the Clerk.

On motion by Mr. Gyger of Cum-berland, the House voted to recede from its former action whereby it passed this bill to be engrossed. Senate Amendment "A" was then adopted, and the bill was passed to be engrossed as amended by Senate Amendment "A" in concurrence. The SPEAKER: The gentleman from Cumberland, Mr. Gyger, suggests a correction in the amendment by underlining the new matter between the single quotes therein. The Clerk will make the correction.

From the Senate: Bill "An Act to Create a Horticultural Commission" (H. P. 1404) (L. D. 601) on which the House accepted the report of the Committee on Agricul-ture reporting "Ought not to pass" on March 31st.

Comes from the Senate, recommitted to the Committee on Agriculture in non-concurrence.

In the House, on motion by Mr. Jordan of South Portland, the House voted to recede from its former action whereby it accepted the "Ought not to pass" report of the committee. The House then con-curred with the Senate in the recommitment of the bill to the Committee on Agriculture.

Senate Bill Tabled

Comes from the Senate, passed to be engrossed as amended by Senate Amendment "A" in non-concurrence.

In the House: Senate Amendment

"A" read by the Clerk.
Mr. STILPHEN of Dresden: Mr. Speaker, I move we recede and concur with the Senate in adopting this amendment. I would say that the bill as amended will amend our present poll tax law.

The SPEAKER: The gentleman from Dresden, Mr. Stilphen, moves that the House recede from its former action whereby it passed Bill "An Act relating to Collection of Poll Taxes" to be engrossed and concur with the Senate in the adoption of Senate Amendment "A" and further concur with the Senate in the passage of the bill to be engrossed as amended by Amendment "A".

On motion by Mr. Dow of Norway, the bill was tabled pending the motion of the gentleman from Dresden, Mr. Stilphen, that the House recede and concur with the Senate in adoption of Senate Amendment

Committee Amendment "A" to H. P. 1616, L. D. 865, Bill, "An Act Relating to Real Estate Brokers."

Amend said Bill by omitting from the third and fourth lines of Sec-

tion 3 the following:

"or to a non-resident broker who is doing business regularly and legally within his own state" and

substitute therefor the following:
'A licensed broker, however, may share his commission with a nonresident broker, even though the latter is not licensed in his own state, or in the state of Maine, pro-vided such non-resident broker is doing business regularly and legally within his own state.'
