SENATE

Thursday, February 16, 1939.

The Senate was called to order by the President. Prayer by the Reverend Louis Sta-

ples of Gardiner.

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

Papers from the House disposed of in concurrence.

Joint Order, relative to printing 500 copies of "Indian Treaties of the State of Maine." (S. P. 121)

(In the Senate on January 24,

read and passed.) Comes from the House, indefi-nitely postponed in non-concurrence.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Spear of Cumberland, the Senate voted to recede and concur with the House on the indefinite postponement of the bill.
