Tuesday, March 7, 1939.

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend John W. Poole of Gardiner.

Journal of Friday, March 3rd, 1939, read and approved.

From the House:

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Spear of Cumberland, the rules were suspended and the Senate voted to reconsider its former action taken on February 28th whereby the bill as amended by Senate Amend-ment A was passed to be engrossed; and on further motion by the same Senator the adoption of Senate Amendment A was reconsidered.

Thereupon, on further motion by the same Senator, House Amend-ment A to Senate Amendment A was read and adopted in concurrence, Senate Amendment A as amended by House Amendment A thereto was adopted in concurrence and the bill as amended by Senate Amendment A, as amended by House Amendment A thereto, was passed to be engrossed in concurrence.

On further motion by the same Sena-tor, the Senate voted to reconsider its action of February 28th whereby House Amendment A was adopted in concurrence.

Thereupon, on further motion by the same Senator, House Amendment A was indefinitely postponed in concurrence, and the bill was passed to be engrossed in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Beckett of Washington, the Senate voted to take from the table, Resolve Authorizing Hiram Corliss of Cherryfield to Bring a Suit at Law against the State of Maine (H. P. 1155) (L. D. 954) tabled by that Senator on February 24th pending reference in concurrence; and on further motion by the same Senator, the bill was referred to the Committee on Judiciary in concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Hill of Cumberland, the Senate voted to take from the table, An Act Relating to Licenses for Dogs (H. P. 924) (L. D. 318), tabled by that Senator on February 22nd pending passage to

be engrossed in concurrence.
