SENATE

Thursday, March 16, 1939.

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend H. E. P. Pressey of Augusta.

Journal of vesterday, read and approved.

From the House:

Bill "An Act Relating to Medical Examiners and Their Duties." P. 29) (L. D. 22) (H.

Comes from the House, having failed on its passage to be enacted. In the Senate:

Mr. CONY of Kennebec: Mr. President, in this matter I would Mr. CONY like to move the appointment of a Committee of Conference. I think perhaps there may be some misunderstanding in connection with this matter. It was passed to be en-grossed with an emergency preamble and the reason for the failure of its passage to be enacted in the House was because of the interference of the 1939 tax collections as the re-sult of a court decision. I therefore would suggest that a Committee of Conference be appointed, so that we may endeavor to straighten out the matter.

Thereupon the Senate voted that a Committee of Conference be appointed and the President appointed as members of such Committee on the part of the Senate, Senators Cony of Kennebec, Chamberlain of Penobscot and Dow of Franklin.

port in concurrence. Mr. GRAVES of Hancock: Mr. President, for the purpose of offering an amendment which I might say I have taken up with members of the Legal Affairs Committee here present, I now move to substitute the bill for the report.

The motion prevailed and the bill was substituted for the report in non-concurrence, and given its first reading.

Thereupon, the same Senator presented Senate Amendment A and moved its adoption:

"Senate Amendment 'A' to Legislative Document 362, bill, 'An Act to Extend the Charter of the Bluehill Water District Company.' Amend said bill by striking out everything after the word 'company' in the third line thereof and inserting in place thereof the following: 'as extended by C. 57, P. & S. L. 1935, and further extended by C. 46, P. & S. L. 1937 are hereby further extended for a period of two years.'"

Senate Amendment A was adopted, and the bill as amended was tomorrow assigned for second reading.

On motion by Mr. Hill of Cumberland, the Senate voted to take from the table, House Report from the Committee on Judiciary: Majority Report, "Ought Not to Pass"; Minority Report "Ought to Pass in New Draft," on An Act Relating to the Enforcement of Executions Against Towns and Citles (H. P. 486) (L. D. 181), tabled by that Senator on March 10th pending acceptance of either report; and on further motion by the same Senator, the majority report of the committee "Ought Not to Pass," was accepted in concurrence. On motion by Mr. Sanborn of Cumberland, the Senate voted to take from the table, House Report from the Committee on Motor Vehicles "Ought Not to Pass" on An Act Authorizing the Secretary of State to Arrange for Expiration of Motor Vehicle Registrations at Stated Period (H. P. 1331) (L. D. 539), tabled by that Senator on March 15th pending acceptance of the report in concurrence; and on further motion by the same Senator, the report of the committee was accepted in concurrence.
