I guess I must confess that perhaps I am behind this idea of having this matter held up, and I just want to ex-

plain it to you. We as a group down in the section where we are supposed to find the money naturally would be against a bill which is going to re-quire us to find money to pay dam-ages in an action of this kind. The thought I had in this is that someone, somehow, is going to pass the buck to the Appropriations Com-mittee, but I just had in mind how much better it would be if these two committees could get together and talk the matter over, and if they decide they are agreeable to this bill, to pay damages done by deer and they can find the money and it can go along, all right—but I do feel that it ought to be joint, through the Committees. THE SPEAKER: The Chair rec-

ognizes the gentleman from Bucksport, Mr. Pierce.

"Sec. 2., P. L., 1933, c. 1, sec. 227-C, sub-sec. 6, amended. Subsection 6 of section 227-C of chapter 1 of the public laws of 1933, as enacted by chapter 328 of the public laws of 1941, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof the following:

; provided, however, that any member whose contributions to the annuity fund are paid by the state under this section who withdraws from or ceases to be a member of the retirement system may not withdraw any of the contributions made by the state under this subsection."

House Amendment "A" was then adopted, and the Bill as amended by Committee Amendment "A" and House Amendment "A" was given its third reading, passed to be engrossed, and sent up for concurrence.
