I do rise for the purpose of bringing to the attention of the Members of the House something that might be of importance, and of great assistance to the Commit-tee on Salaries and Fees, to bear in mind. I remember this particular Your Committee tried instance.

its best to get all the information possible. I remember myself asking this gentleman if he could tell me how much time he put in. I was not completely satisfied with

his answer.

I do not recall at that time that the lady from Bath (Miss Deering) appeared before the Committee, either for or against this bill; but the point I want to make is this. Your Committee on Salaries and Fees is attempting, as best it can, to work out a solution to the problems that are given to it to solve, and I assure you that there are some problems. Now, in the future, when matters of this nature come before the Committee, if the members of this House would come before the Committee and give us such information as they have, it would be of great assistance to the Committee, and your Committee perhaps might not be in a position, as they find themselves this morning, of feeling that probably they were too generous. I assure you that it is not the intention of the Committee on Salaries and Fees—I speak for myself, perhaps, alone—to be any more generous than is absolutely necessary in the matter of increases in salaries.

The SPEAKER: The question before the House is on the motion of the gentlewoman from Bath, Miss Deering, that Bill "An Act relating to the Salary of the Register of Probate of Sagadahoc County" (H. P. 118) (L. D. 72) be indefinitely postponed. All those in favor of the motion will say aye; those opposed, no.

A viva voce vote being taken, the motion prevailed and the Bill was indefinitely postponed and sent up

for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Denny of Damariscotta, under suspension of the rules, the House voted to reconsider its action of February 24th whereby Bill "An Act Relating to Slaughterhouses" (H. P. 1221) (L. D. 708) was referred to the Committee on Legal Affairs; and on further motion by the same gentleman the Bill was referred to the Committee on Public Health in non-concurrence, and sent up for concurrence.
