The SPEAKER: The Chair lays before the House at this time the first tabled and today assigned matter, being House Report "Ought not to be passed" of the Committee on Rules and Business of the House on House Order relative to amending House Rule No. 4, which was tabled on January 28 by the gentleman from Gardiner, Mr. Johnson, pending the motion of the gentleman from Bath, Mr. McClure, to substitute the Order for the Report.

The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Bath, Mr. McClure.

Mr. McCLURE: Mr. Speaker, it has been brought to my attention that Mr. Johnson is confined to his home by illness, and I would say, out of courtesy to him at this time, that we re-table the bill and have it assigned for another day. Furthermore, I might state, while Mr. Johnson is not here, that I received about twenty-five or fifty letters in regard—

The SPEAKER: The Chair will have to state that the motion is not debatable.

The gentleman from Bath, Mr. McClure, moves that the first today assigned matter lie upon the table. Is this the pleasure of the House? The motion prevailed.

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Unity, Mr. Brown.

Mr. BROWN: Mr. Speaker and Members of the House: I wish to call the attention of the members this morning to the Legislative Research Committee report which is on your desks this morning. This report will show the method of taxation in the various states in the Union with the tax yields. I sincerely hope that every member in this body will read this report and especially compare the methods of taxation in the various states with that of the State of Maine.

Mr. WILLIAMS: Mr. Speaker and Members of the House: This is the first time in my legislative experience that I have in any way made a suggestion in regard to reference of bills. However, this bill, as you will note from its title, relates to the Retirement Fund of State employees in the armed forces. All such bills, during the past eight

years, have been referred to your Judiciary Committee. It would seem that there is no change in policy contemplated as we have this morning referred two bills relating to the Retirement Act to the Judiciary Committee. Therefore, I now move that "An Act relating to Retirement Fund of State Employees in Armed Forces" be referred to the Judiciary Committee.

The ŠPEAKER: The gentleman from Auburn, Mr. Williams, moves that "An Act relating to Retirement Fund of State Employees in Armed Forces," being House Paper 584. be referred to the Committee on Judiciary. Is this the pleasure of the House?

The motion prevailed and the Bill was referred to the Committee on Judiciary and sent up for concurrence.
