Amend the title of said Bill by inserting in the 2nd line thereof before the word "School" where it first appears the word 'and'.

Further amend said title by striking out therefrom the following words "and School Activity Funds".

Amend said Bill by striking out in the 2nd paragraph of that part designated as "Sec. 1" thereof the last underlined sentence.

Further amend said Bill by adding before the underlined word "school" where it first appears in the 6th line of that part designated "Sec. 119" the underlined word 'or'.

Further amend said Bill by striking out in the 6th and 7th lines of that part designated "Sec. 119" thereof the following underlined words ", or school activity funds".

Further amend said Bill by striking out in the 4th line of that part designated "Sec. 3." thereof after the underlined word "districts" the underlined ",".

Further amend said Bill by striking out at the end of that part designated "Sec. 3." thereof the underlined words "and for school activities, by local school funds"

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 755, L. D. 292, Bill "An Act Relating to the Ashland Water and Sewer District."

Amend said Bill by inserting before the enacting clause thereof, the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, the source of water of the Ashland Water and Sewer District has been condemned by state officials and the source of supply for fire protection is inadequate; and

Whereas, various tests for an adequate supply of water from test wells have been unsuccessful and the Ashland Water and Sewer District have been obliged to extend their pipe line to Big Machias Stream; and

Whereas, additional funds are necessary for the installation of this system; and

this system; and Whereas, work must be commenced in the spring so that the project will be completed by fall; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the legislature these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the constitution of Maine, and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Further amend said Bill by adding at the end thereof, the following:

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this act shall take effect when approved.'

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 1887, L. D. 1205, Bill "An Act to Provide Forest Fire Prevention and Control in Unorganized Areas Not in the Maine Forestry District."

Amend said Bill by striking out in the 6th line the underlined words "on a valuation determined by the state tax assessor" and by adding after the period at the end of said 6th line the following underlined sentence: "The valuation as determined by the board of equalization and set forth in the statement filed by it as provided by section 65 of chapter 14 shall be the basis for the computation and apportionment of the tax assessed."

Thereupon, House Amendment "A" was adopted, the Bill was read the third time, passed to be engrossed as amended by House Amendment "A" and sent to the Senate.

#### Orders of the Day

The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Bath, Mr. McClure.

Mr. McCLURE: Mr. Speaker, at the time I asked for unanimous consent, I thought I was well within my rights and that I would have time. I find, though, in looking the matter up, that we have a bill which is a legislative document which can be brought out of committee in a new draft under a new title and will accomplish our object, so I withdraw my request for unanimous consent to present a new bill.

That is my only reason for reassigning the matter for Thursday.
