Orders of the Day

the same Senator, the bill was re-
ferred to the Committee on Judici-
ary and ordered printed.

Mr. EDWARDS of Oxford: Mr.
President, I would like to inquire
if Senate Paper 87 is still in the
possession of the Senate.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair will
state that it is, having been held for
reconsideration at the request of
the Senator from Oxford.

Mr. EDWARDS: Mr. President
and members of the Senate, last
week I introduced two bills, spon-
sored by the members of the dental
profession, having to do with laws
governing the members of that pro-
fession. One was referred to the
committee on Judiciary and the
other to the Committee on Public
Health. In order that the sponsors

of this bill may not have to make
an extra trip over here to appear
before the committee I would like
to have these bills referred to one
committee. I would say that I have
spoken with the chairmen of the
two committees and also with the
Committee on Reference of Bills
and they have no objection. So I
therefore move that we reconsider
our former action whereby this
Senate Paper 87 was referred to
the Committee on Public Health.

Thereupon, the Senate voted to
reconsider its former action where-
by bill An Act Relating to Fees of
and Examination by Board of Den-
tal Examiners (S. P. 87) was re-
ferred to the Committee on Public
Health; and on further motion by
the same Senator, the bill was re-
ferred to the Committee on Judici-
ary.
