SENATE

Tuesday, February 1, 1949.

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend Elmer Colcord of Gardiner.

The PRESIDENT: The Chair notes in the Senate, the presence of the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Boutin, and the Chair requests the Minority Floor Leader, Senator Boucher, to conduct Senator-elect Boutin to the Governor so that he may be sworn in and may take his seat among us.

Thereupon, Senator-elect Ernest A. Boutin was escorted to the office of the Governor by Senator Boucher of Androscoggin.

The PRESIDENT: Before going on with the order of business, we will await the return of Senator Boucher. It will probably be only a few minutes.

Subsequently Senator Boucher returned with the Senator from Androscoggin, Senator Boutin, and reported that that Senator had been duly sworn into office by His Excellency, the Governor.

Senator Boutin assumed his seat in the Senate, amid the applause of the Senate.
