I think it might be well if we revived the rule for the information of the legislature as that would keep both the Appropriation Committee and the Senate up to date as to the financial picture that faces the legislature. If the chairmen of the various committees will consult with their clerks and see that this is done, I think it would facilitate the work of the legislature.
