SENATE

Monday, April 16, 1951.

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Rev. Merle E. Golding of Augusta.

Journal of Friday, April 13th, 1951, read and approved.

From the House

Bill "An Act Relating to the Importation of Poisonous Snakes." (H. P. 327) (L. D. 187)

(In the Senate, on April 12th, Report B—"Ought Not to Pass"—accepted in non-concurrence.)

Comes from the House, that body having insisted on its former action whereby the bill was passed to be engrossed, and now asks for a Committee of Conference.

In the Senate: On motion by Mr. Haskell of Penobscot, the Senate voted to insist on its former action, whereby the "Ought Not to Pass" report of the Committee was accepted, and join with the House in a Committee of Conference.

Subsequently the president appointed as members of such Committee on the part of the Senate: Senators Haskell of Penobscot, Savage of Somerset and Barnes of Aroostook.
