#### SENATE

#### Monday, April 30, 1951

The Senate was called to order by the President.

Prayer by the Reverend Ed. W. Grilley, Jr., of Augusta.

Journal of Friday, April 27, 1951, read and approved.

#### From the House

Bill "An Act Repealing the Merit Award Board." (H. P. 1252) (L. D. 826)

(In Senate, on April 26th, the "Ought Not to Pass" report was accepted in non-concurrence.)

Come from the House, that body having insisted on its former action whereby the bill was substituted for the report, and passed to be engrossed,—and now asks for a Committee of Conference.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Ward of Penobscot, the Senate voted to insist and join.

The Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game on Bill "An Act Relating to Hunting and Fishing by Certain Persons," (H. P. 314) (L. D. 172) reported that the same ought not to pass.

Comes from the House, the bill substituted for the report, and passed to be engrossed as amended by House Amendment 'A."

In the Senate:

Mr. ELA of Somerset: Mr. President, I move acceptance of the report.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Noyes of Hancock, the bill and accompanying papers were laid upon the table pending motion by Senator Ela that the report of the committee be accepted.

"Resolve Appropriating Moneys to Effectuate Salary Plan for State Employees," (H. P. 804) (L. D. 477)

(In Senate, on April 2nd, passed to be engrossed as amended by Senate Amendment "A" in nonconcurrence.)

Comes from the House, that body having reconsidered engrossing, and Committee Amendment "A" was indefinitely postponed; Senate Amendment "A" adopted in concurrence. Subsequently, under suspension of the rules, engrossing was again reconsidered, Senate Amendment "A" was indefinitely postponed, and the bill as amended by House Amendment "A" was passed to be engrossed, in non-concurrence.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Brewer of Aroostook, the Senate voted to recede and concur.

The Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game on Bill "An Act Relating to Free Hunting and Fishing Licenses for Maine Veterans on Leave," (H. P. 57) (L. D. 23) reported that the same ought not to pass.

On motion by Mrs. Kavanagh of Androscoggin, tabled pending acceptance of the report.

The Committee on Claims on "Resolve, in Favor of Christian M. Jensen of Westbrook," (H. P. 11) (L. D. 1321) reported that the same ought to pass.

The same Committee on "Resolve, to Reimburse Freeport Grain Company for Damage Done by Escapee," (H. P. 1523) (L. D. 1331) reported that the same ought to pass.

The same Committee on "Resolve, in Favor of Arthur W. Mc-Lellan of Topsfield," (H. P. 1559) (L. D. 1332) reported that the same ought to pass.

The same Committee on "Resolve, in Favor of C. H. Mallory of Strong," (H. P. 1569) (L. D. 1334) reported that the same ought to pass.

The same Committee on "Resolve, in Favor of Dwight D. Dixon of Clinton," (H. P. 1604) (L. D. 1335) reported that the same ought to pass.

The same Committee on "Resolve, in Favor of W. I. Hamilton of Bath," (H. P. 1648) (L. D. 1336) reported that the same ought to pass.

The Committee on Judiciary on "Resolve, in Favor of Carrie M. Longfellow of Machias," (H. P. 1015) (L. D. 1344) reported that the same ought to pass.

The same Committee on "Resolve, Providing for State Pension for Mrs. Minnie Fenderson of Saco," (H. P. 1455) (L. D. 1343) reported that the same ought to pass.

Which reports were severally read and accepted in concurrence, the resolves read once, and under suspension of the rules read a second time and passed to be engrossed, in concurrence.

The Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game on Bill "An Act Relating to Guides' Qualifications, License and License Revocation," (H. P. 1005) (L. D. 593) reported the same in a new draft (H. P. 1783) (L. D. 1340) under the same title and that it ought to pass.

The Committee on Judiciary on "Resolve, Granting a Pension to James E. Harvey of Readfield," (H. P. 1016) reported the same in a new draft (H. P. 1785) (L. D. 1342) under the same title, and that it ought to pass.

The Committee on Liquor Control to which was re-committed Bill "An Act Relating to the Liquor Commission," (H. P. 935) (L. D. 543) reported the same in a new draft (H. P. 1786) (L. D. 1346) under the same title and that it ought to pass.

Which reports were severally read and accepted in concurrence, the bills in new draft read once, and under suspension of the rules read a second time and passed to be engrossed in concurrence.

The Committee on Inland Fisheries and Game on Bill "An Act Repealing the Law on Motor Vehicle Damage by Wild Birds and Animals," (H. P. 1476) (L. D. 1084) reported the same in a new draft (H. P. 1759) (L. D. 1303) under a new title, Bill "An Act Prohibiting Claims of Damage to Motor Vehicles by Wild Animals and Birds," and that it ought to pass.

Which report was read and accepted in concurrence, and the bill in new draft and under new title, read once, and tomorrow assigned for second reading.

The Committee on Claims on "Resolve in Favor of Allagash

Plantation," (H. P. 1560) (L. D. 1337) reported that the same ought to pass as amended by Committee Amendment "A".

Which report was read and accepted in concurrence, and the resolve read once; Committee Amendment "A" was read and adopted in concurrence, and the resolve as amended was tomorrow assigned for second reading.

#### Orders of the Day

Mr. CROSBY of Franklin: Mr. President, I would like to ask if H. P. 1679, L. D. 1247, An Act Relating to Fees for Boiler Inspection and Certificates is in the hands of the Senate?

The PRESIDENT: The Chair will state that the document is in the possession of the Senate having been recalled from the Governor by Joint Order.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Crosby of Franklin, the rules were suspended and the Senate voted to reconsider its former action whereby the bill was enacted and to further reconsider its action whereby the bill was passed to be engrossed.
