The SPEAKER: The Chair recognizes the gentleman from Brooks, Mr. Dickey.

Mr. DICKEY: Mr. Speaker, I would like unanimous consent to address the House.

The SPEAKER: The Chair would inquire if the gentleman from Brooks, Mr. Dickey, desires to make a motion at this time.

Mr. DICKEY: I do not, Mr. Speaker. I would like a minute of explanation in regard to the Joint Order on Road Resolves.

The SPEAKER: The Chair would request the gentleman to make certain that there is nothing to come up under Orders of the Day and the Chair does understand that the gentleman from Auburn, Mr. Jacobs, has something to come up under Orders of the Day, then the Chair will be happy to entertain the gentleman's request.

Mr. DICKEY: With the permission of the Chair, I will be very happy to do so.

The SPEAKER: The gentleman may proceed.

Mr. DICKEY: From now on the procedure in regard to your special resolves having to do with the \$150,000 fund, if you make up your own resolve, do not take it to the Research office, do not take it to Mr. Slosberg, but hand it directly to the House Chairman on Highways, Mr. Ludwig, whose seat is No. 47.
