Joint Resolution

WHEREAS, an honored General of our United States Army and one who has already given distinguished service to our country and its people, has been destined by fate to be our thirty-fourth president;

BE IT RESOLVED that the Senate and House of Representatives of the State of Maine in the Legislature assembled hereby expresses its sense of appreciation for the eminent leadership, which many of the members of this Legislature have already had an opportunity to observe in the field of military service, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there be spread upon the records of this Legislature an appreciation of the high esteem for the fine manhood, splendid ability and lofty purpose of Dwight D. Eisenhower, President of the United States, and that a message of congratulations be sent to him from this Legislature together with its best wishes for his health and prosperity and the continued honor greatness of our and common country.
