Thursday, March 3, 1955

The PRESIDENT: At this time the Chair takes great pleasure in presenting formally to you Senator Lockhart of New Haven. I am sure you will be interested in the message he will give us and that you will be particularly interested in the reasons that bring him to our Senate Chamber. (Applause)

Mr. LOCKHART: Mr. President, honored Members of the Senate and guests here today: I am exceedingly happy to have been given this opportunity to appear briefly in the Maine Senate. I am a Senator in Connecticut and I have been struggling with a series of problems which I find are repeated here. I find that you do have some problems about taxes, that you do have some problems about appropriations, and even perhaps on the fringes a little bit of conflict between things called political parties, which are quite familiar to us down the line.

I have been engaged in the course of the last few years and am fairly

active at it now in research on the politics and especially the role of the various legisltures of all of New England, and I have been fascinated with the work I have done on Maine. I know I have only touched the very periphery of what Maine is and what Maine means, but the more I have been here the more I have come to love it, and I appreciate very, very much the hospitality I have been shown. I also appreciate the sanity and the wisdom with which Maine approaches her problems. I have enjoyed every minute of my visit here and I hope I may be back again frequently. Thank you very much. (Applause)

"Resolve Regulating Fishing in Sawyer's Pond in Southport." (H. P. 471) (L. D. 516)

Which resolve, being an emergency measure, and having received the affirmative vote of 27 members of the Senate and none opposed was finally passed.

Additional House Paper:

Emergency Measure, bill, "An Act Increasing Amount of Bonds of Town of Litchfield School District." (H. P. 621) (L. D. 664)

Which bill being an emergency measure and having received the affirmative vote of 28 members of the Senate and none opposed, was passed to be enacted.

Orders of the Day

On motion by Senator Hillman of Penobscot, the Senate voted to take from the table Bill "An Act relating to Free Fishing Licenses to Residents 75 years of Age" (H. P. 101) (L. D. 109 tabled by that Senator earlier in today's session; and on further motion by the same Senator the Senate voted to insist on its former action and join in a Committee of Conference.

The Chair thereupon appointed the following conferees on the part of the Senate:

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On motion by Mr. Weeks of Cumberland, the Senate voted to take from the table Senate Report "Ought to pass" from the Committee on Judiciary on Bill "An Act Repealing County Laws relating to Meridian Lines and Standards of Length" (S. P. 156) (L. D. 350) tabled by that Senator on February 22 pending consideration of the report.

Mr. REID of Kennebec: Mr. President, although I see I did not table this bill I do see it is my bill. I wanted to take it from the table to get it off the calendar and for the purpose of offering an amendment. The fact is it is a bill which would delete from the statutes several sections relating to county markers which have been established for the purpose of correcting magnetic variations from time to time. In Kennebec County it requires two markers and one of them has already been removed and one of them is not only usless but it interferes with the mowing of the lawn in front of the Court House. When the bill was originally introduced the committee was informed that such markers were useless throughout the State, so the bill actually abolished the law completely. Since then it has been discovered that there are some counties in which these markers continue to be useful to engineers. If the Senate will go along with the adoption of the committee report I will offer an amendment which will make the law applicable only to Kennebec County. I therefore move acceptance of the "Ought to pass" report of the Committee.

The PRESIDENT: The Senator from Kennebec, Senator Reid, moves

that the Senate accept the "Ought to pass" report of the committee. Is this the pleasure of the Senate?

The motion prevailed and the "Ought to pass" report of the committee was accepted and the bill given its first reading.

Senator Reid then presented Senate Amendment "A" and moved its adoption.

Senate Amendment "A" was read by the Secretary as follows:

SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S. P. 156, L. D. 350, Bill "An Act Repealing County Laws relating to Meridian Lines and Standards of Length."

Amend said Bill by striking out the Title and inserting in place thereof the following Title:

'An Ace relating to Meridian Lines and Standards of Length in Kennebec County.'

Further amend said Bill by striking out all after the enacting clause and inserting in place thereof the following:

"R. S., c. 89, Sec. 94-A, additional. Chapter 89 of the revised statutes is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section, to be numbered 94-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 94-A. Exception. The provisions of sections 89 to 94, inclusive, shall not apply to the county of Kennebec.' "

Senate Amendment "A" was adopted and the bill was assigned for second reading at the time of convening of the next legislative day.
