Passed to Be Enacted Emergency Measure

Resolve to Aid Settlement of Hungarian Refugees in Maine (S. P. 110) (L. D. 221)

Was reported by the Committee on Engrossed Bills as truly and strictly engrossed. This being an emergency measure and a two-thirds vote of all the members elected to the House being necessary, a division was had. 145 voted in favor of same and none against, and accordingly the Resolve was finally passed, signed by the Speaker and sent to the Senate.

Orders of the Day

The SPEAKER: The Chair lays before the House the first tabled and today assigned matter, Bill "An Act relating to Procedure to Repair or Demolish Buildings after Fire", House Paper 25, Legislative Document 30, tabled on January 24 by the gentleman from Portland, Mr. Childs, pending third reading.

The Bill was given its third reading.

The SPEAKER: The gentleman from Portland, Mr. Childs, offers House Amendment "A" and moves its adoption. The Clerk will read House Amendment "A".

House Amendment "A" was read by the Clerk as follows:

HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H. P. 25, L. D. 30, Bill "An Act relating

to procedure to repair or demolish buildings after fire."

Amend said bill by striking out the period at the end and inserting in place thereof the following:

, or the court may authorize the town to cause such building or premises to be forthwith repaired, torn down or demolished and such materials removed and all dangerous conditions remedied, as the case may be, at the expense of the town in which such property is situated; and if the owner thereof, within 30 days after notice in writing of the amount of such expense, fails, neglects or refuses to repay said town the expense thereby incurred, a special tax may be assessed by the assessors against the land on which said building was located for the amount of such expenses, and such amount shall be included in the next annual warrant to the tax collector of said town for collection, and shall be collected in the same manner as other state, county and municipal taxes are collected.

Thereupon, House Amendment "A" was adopted, and the Bill as amended by House Amendment "A" was passed to be engrossed and sent to the Senate.

The SPEAKER: Continuing under Orders of the Day, the Chair lays before the House the second tabled and today assigned matter, Bill "An Act relating to Payment of Salaries of Members of the Legislature," Senate Paper 111, Legislative Document 238, tabled on January 29 by the gentlewoman from Presque Isle, Mrs. Christie, pending reference.

On motion of the gentlewoman from Presque Isle, Mrs. Christie, under suspension of the rules, the Bill was given its three several readings without reference to any Committee, and passed to be engrossed in concurrence.

On motion of Mr. Beane of Augusta,

Adjourned until one o'clock tomorrow afternoon.
