SENATE

Friday, May 22, 1959

Senate called to order by the President.

Prayer by Rev. Douglas H Robins of Augusta.

On motion by Mr. Duquette of York,

Journal of yesterday read and approved.

Order

On motion by Mr. Woodcock of Penobscot, out of order and under suspension of the rules:

ORDERED, the House concurring, that when the Senate and House adjourn, they adjourn to meet on Monday, May 25, at four o'clock in the afternoon. (S. P. 499)

Which was read and passed.

Sent down for concurrence.

Papers from the House

Bill, "An Act to Authorize the County Commissioners of Cumberland County to Issue Bonds for Construction of a County Jail." (S. P. 264) (L. D. 677)

In Senate on May 20, passed to be engrossed as amended by House Amendment D (Filing No. 359)

Comes from the House, that body having Insisted upon its former action whereby the bill was passed to be engrossed as amended by House Amendment B (Filing No. 207) House Amendment C (Filing No. 241) as amended by House Amendment A (Filing No. 368) thereto; and House Amendment D, now asks for a Committee of Conference.

In the Senate, on motion by Mr. Weeks of Cumberland, the Senate voted to insist and join in the Committee of Conference; the Chair appointed as Senate Conferees, Senators: Weeks of Cumberland, Lord of Cumberland and Wyman of Washington.

Bill, "An Act Relating to Effective Date for Salary Increase for County Officers and Judges and Recorders of Municipal Courts." (H. P. 869) (L. D. 1237)

In Senate on May 20, passed to be engrossed as amended by Committee Amendment A (Filing No. 314) in non-concurrence.

Comes from the House, that body having Insisted upon its former action whereby the bill was indefinitely postponed, now asks for Committee of Conference.

**House Committee Report
Ought to Pass - N. D.**

The Committee on Highways on Bill, "An Act to Construct a Bridge between Lubec and Campobello Island." (H. P. 970) (L. D. 1379) under same title, and that it Ought to Pass.

On motion by Mr. Stilphen of Knox, the report was read and accepted in concurrence, the bill in New Draft read once. Under suspension of the rules, the bill was given its second reading.

On motion by Mr. Wyman of Washington, tabled pending engrossment.

Mr. MacDONALD of Oxford presented the following Order and moved its passage:

ORDERED, the House concurring, that (S. P. 155) (L. D. 307) Resolve in Favor of Jim Adams Inc. of Bangor, be recalled to the Senate from the Legislative Files.

Thereupon, on motion by Mr. Parker of Piscataquis, the Order was laid upon the table pending passage.

**Senate Committee Report
Committee of Conference**

The Committee of Conference on the disagreeing action of the two branches of the Legislature on Bill, "An Act Relating to Source of Supply of Bangor Water District." (S. P. 476) (L. D. 1342)

Reported that the Committee of Conference cannot agree.

Which report was read and accepted.

Sent down for concurrence.

Enactors

The Committee on Engrossed Bills reported as truly and strictly engrossed the following Bills and Resolve:

Bill, "An Act Regulating Certain Insurance Sold in Connection with Credit Transactions." (H. P. 947) (L. D. 1343)

On motion by Mr. Lessard of Androscoggin, tabled pending enactment.

Bill, "An Act Relating to Reapportionment of School Directors of School Administrative Districts." (S. P. 345) (L. D. 972)

Which was passed to be enacted.

Bill, "An Act Relating to Augmenting of Stored Water." (S. P. 467) (L. D. 1363)

On motion by Mr. Carpenter of Somerset, tabled pending passage to be enacted.

Bill, "An Act to Reactivate the State Committee on Educational Television." (S. P. 493) (L. D. 1371)

On motion by Mr. Pierce of Hancock, the bill was laid upon the Special Appropriations Table pending enactment.

"Resolve Relating to Non-lapsing Moneys for Construction of Eastport-Perry Causeway-Dam." (H. P. 884) (L. D. 1258)

On motion by Mr. Pierce of Hancock, tabled pending final passage.

On motion by Mr. Woodcock of Penobscot

Recessed until ten-thirty.

After Recess

The Senate was called to order by the President.

On motion by Mr. Woodcock of Penobscot, the Senate voted to take from the table Item 41 being Joint Order relative to Recalling Bills not reported out of Committee by May

22 (H. P. 972) tabled by that Senator on May 20 pending passage; and on further motion by the same Senator, the Joint Order was indefinitely postponed in non-concurrence.

Sent down for concurrence.

On motion by Mr. Noyes of Franklin, the Senate voted to take from the table the 30th tabled item being Resolve, Opening Wilson Lake, Franklin County to Ice Fishing (H. P. 66) (L. D. 104) tabled by that Senator on May 11 pending consideration; and on motion by Mr. Carpenter of Somerset the Senate voted to recede and concur.

Mr. HILLMAN of Penobscot: Mr. President, we have in the Senate this morning the very lovely and gracious wife of the President of the Senate, and at this time, I would like to suggest that the Sergeant-at-Arms escort this young lady to a seat at the right of her husband.

Thereupon, the Sergeant-at-Arms escorted Mrs. John Reed, wife of the President of the Senate, to the rostrum. (Applause of the Senate, members rising.)

The PRESIDENT: The Chair thanks the Senator from Penobscot, Senator Hillman for his courteous remarks to the wife of the Chair.

On motion by Mr. Parker of Piscataquis, the Senate voted to take from the table Joint Order Relative to Recalling L. D. 307 from the legislative files, tabled by that Senator earlier in today's session pending passage; and that Senator yielded to the Senator from Oxford, Senator MacDonald.

Thereupon, Mr. MacDonald was granted permission to withdraw the Order.
