LD 398 / HP0290

An Act to Require the Revocation of Probation for a Person Convicted of Domestic Violence if the Person Fails to Attend a Certified Batterers' Intervention Program. Presented by Representative STANLEY of Medway; Cosponsored by Senator CATHCART of Penobscot and Representatives: AHEARNE of Madawaska, CLARK of Millinocket, GOODWIN of Pembroke, HATCH of Skowhegan, RINES of Wiscasset. Referred to Joint Standing Committee on Criminal Justice. Public Hearing 02/09/99. House: Indefinitely Postponed 05/07/99. Senate: Majority (ONTP) Accepted 05/10/99. Final Disposition: Died in Concurrence 05/10/99.
