An Act To Clarify the Prescribing and Dispensing of Naloxone Hydrochloride by Pharmacists. (Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 205.) Presented by Speaker GIDEON of Freeport. Referred to Joint Standing Committee on Labor, Commerce, Research and Economic Development. Public Hearing 04/02/18. Majority (OTP-AM) Report Accepted 04/12/18. Amended by: CA H-744. Final Disposition: Emergency Enacted, PUBLIC LAW, Chapter 417. (Veto Overridden Emergency 05/02/18).
