An Act to Protect Businesses from Fraudulent or Predatory Financial Settlements by Allowing Those Businesses Opportunities to Remove Architectural Barriers in Noncompliance with the Maine Human Rights Act. (Approved for introduction by a majority of the Legislative Council pursuant to Joint Rule 205.) Presented by Sen. DAUGHTRY of Cumberland. Referred to the Joint Standing Committee on Judiciary. Public Hearing 02/07/24. Final Disposition: Ought Not to Pass Pursuant to Joint Rule 310 03/05/24.
