CHAPTER 114.

DUTIES PAYABLE BY PUBLIC OFFICERS, ATTORNEYS, AND IN-SPECTORS.

SEC. 1. Duties payable by public officers.

Sheriffs of the counties of York, Cumberland, Lincoln, Kennebec, and Penobscot, fifty dollars each; and of other counties, twenty-five dollars each.

Clerks of the judicial courts for the counties of York, Cumberland, Lincoln, Kennebec, and Penobscot, forty dollars each; and for other counties, twenty-five dollars each.

County attorneys, five dollars each.

Judges of probate, seven dollars each.

Registers of probate, ten dollars each.

Justices of the peace, five dollars each.

SEC. 2. No person shall be admitted as an attorney, until he Duties payable has paid, to the treasurer of the county where he is admitted, by attorneys. twenty dollars, and produced a receipt therefor to the court. ٥<u>3</u>.

SEC. 3. Every inspector of fish, on being qualified, shall pay, Duties payable to the treasurer of the town in which he resides, five dollars, by inspectors of fish. which shall be paid to the treasurer of state on or before the R. S., c. 149, twentieth day of January annually.
