IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-THREE.

AN ACT

TO REVISE AND CONSOLIDATE THE PUBLIC LAWS OF THE STATE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE SENATE AND HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES IN LEGISLATURE ASSEMBLED, in the manner stated under the several titles and chapters as follows, not including head notes or marginal notes or references:

and shall pay quarterly from the treasury of said city, town, or planta- Chap. 144. tion, to the pensioner, the amount specified and for the time specified by town in said certificate, and take vouchers therefor, and the same shall be 1871, c.179, § 5. re-imbursed to said treasurer from the treasury of the State.

The necessary blanks shall be issued to the mayors of cities, selectmen of towns and assessors of plantations, as the governor may direct, and the expense of printing and distribution shall be paid out of the treasury of the State.

Blanks shall town officers, at State's expense. 1871, c.179, § 6.

SEC. 7. No officer of any city, town, or plantation shall receive any fees or compensation from the State for services performed under this chapter, or in carrying its provisions into effect.

officers are not entitled to fees. 1872, c. 5, § 2.

The foregoing act, from chapter one to chapter one hundred and forty-four, both inclusive, shall take effect and become law on the first day of January, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-four.
