CHAPTER 3

EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

51. Compensation and expense of members.

52. Expiration of orders at end of term; exceptions.

§ 51. Compensation and expense of members

Each member of the Executive Council shall receive the same compensation and travel as a Representative to the Legislature, for services as a Councilor during the session of the Council commencing in January and closing immediately after the adjournment of the Legislature. For services at other sessions of the Council, each member thereof shall receive \$20 for each session, and actual expenses. For authorized services on committees when the Council is not in session, each Councilor shall receive \$5 a day and actual expenses.

§ 52. Expiration of orders at end of term; exceptions

Any order issued by the Governor and Council, except orders relating to the appointment of officers and employees of the State authorized by law, or fixing their compensation, and orders authorizing contracts which may not be wholly performed during the term of the Council passing such orders, shall cease to be of any effect or validity at the end of the biennium for which the Council passing the order was elected.
