#### CHAPTER 1

#### BOWLING, POOL AND SHOOTING GALLERIES

1. Unlicensed alleys and billiard rooms.

##### § 1. Unlicensed alleys and billiard rooms

Whoever keeps a bowling alley, shooting gallery, pool, bagatelle or billiard room without a license forfeits \$10 for each day that such alley, gallery or room is so kept.

##### § 2. Licenses

Municipal officers of towns may license suitable persons to keep bowling alleys, shooting galleries, pool, bagatelle and bil-

liard rooms therein, in any place where it will not disturb the peace and quiet of a family, for which the person licensed shall pay \$10 to such town. Such licenses expire on the first day of May after they are granted, unless sooner revoked.

**§ 3. Minors on premises**

A licensee, maintaining and operating a bowling alley, shooting gallery, pool, bagatelle or billiard room, who permits a minor to remain in or on his premises after having been forbidden to do so in writing by the minor's parent or guardian shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months.
