#### CHAPTER 39

#### CONSPIRACY

951. Definition; penalty.

952. Prosecution of innocent person.

### § 951. Definition; penalty

If 2 or more persons conspire and agree together, with the fraudulent or malicious intent wrongfully and wickedly to injure the person, character, business or property of another; or for one or more of them to sell intoxicating liquor in this State in violation of law to one or more of the others; or to do any illegal act injurious to the public trade, health, morals, police or administration of public justice; or to commit a crime punishable by imprisonment in the State Prison, they are guilty of a conspiracy. Every such offender and every person convicted of conspiracy at common law shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment for not more than 10 years.

## § 952. Prosecution of innocent person

If 2 or more persons conspire and agree together, with intent falsely, fraudulently and maliciously to cause another person to be indicted or in any way prosecuted for an offense of which he is innocent, whether he is prosecuted or not, they are guilty of a conspiracy, and each shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment for not more than 5 years.
