CHAPTER 13
DISTRICT MEETINGS

411. School district meetings; validating clause.

§ 411. School district meetings; validating clause

Where the inhabitants and territory of a single municipality constitute an incorporated school district, and the charter of such district contains no provisions for the calling and holding of meetings of such district, meetings of such school district shall be called by the municipal officers, in the manner provided by law for the calling of town meetings, on written request signed by trustees or other executive officers of the district, and any lawfully called meeting of the inhabitants of the municipality shall be a lawful meeting of the school district for the transaction of school district business. In cases in which the business of such school district has hitherto been transacted at meetings of the inhabitants, so called and held, such meetings are declared to be legal and valid meetings of the school district, and all votes passed thereat, and all actions taken in accordance therewith, which would have been legal had the meetings been lawfully called meetings of the school district, are ratified and declared legal.
