STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVES relating to the construction of a Rail Road from lake Michigan to the Pacific coast.

Resolved, That a Rail Road from Lake Michigan to

- 2 the Pacific coast, is highly desirable, and if practicable,
- 3 should be constructed. Such a work would open a
- 4 vast and unbroken wilderness for improvement and
- 5 cultivation—would unite and bind together the people
- 6 of the Atlantic and Pacific slopes, by connecting their
- 7 interests and associations—would extend our com-
- 8 merce, advance the welfare of our manufactures,
- 9 and elevate the dignity of man.

Resolved, That in our opinion, the only plan by

- 2 which so stupenduous a work can be accomplished,
- 3 is to appropriate and set apart the public lands along
- 4 the line of the same, and to pledge the proceeds of

5 sale, to that object, thus making the sale and settlement6 of these lands, subservient to this great enterprize.

Resolved, That the plan of Asa Whitney, Esq., of

- 2 New York, as explained by himself, meets our cordial
- 3 approval, and we concur in recommending it.

Resolved, That our senators in Congress be instruct2 ed, and our representatives be requested, by their
3 votes and acts to promote said object, by granting
4 the right and power to Asa Whitney, Esq., to con5 struct said road, and to pledge the public lands along
6 the line of said work, to erect the same, in such man7 ner as will promote and secure the rights and inter8 ests of the whole Union, and best serve to accomplish

Resolved, That the Governor cause copies of these 2 Resolutions to be furnished to the Governors of each 3 of the States respectively, and also to each of our 4 senators and representatives in Congress.
