AN ACT to establish Teachers' Institutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Whenever reasonable assurance shall

- 2 be given to the board of education, that a suitable
- 3 number of the teachers of public schools in any
- 4 county, shall desire to assemble for the purpose of
- 5 forming a teachers' institute, and to remain in ses-
- 6 sion for a period not less than ten working days, said
- 7 board, by a committee of their body, or by their sec-
- 8 retary, or by such person or persons as they may des-
- 9 ignate, shall appoint a time and place for said meet-

- 10 ing, make suitable arrangements therefor and give11 notice thereof.
 - Sec. 2. For the purpose of defraying the expenses
 - 2 of rooms, lights, or other necessary charges, and for
 - 3 procuring teachers and lecturers for said institutes,
 - 4 the board of education by their committee or secre-
 - 5 tary, may draw upon the treasurer of the state for a
 - 6 sum not exceeding two hundred dollars for any one
 - 7 institute.
 - Sec. 3. To meet the expenditure aforesaid, the
 - 2 governor is hereby authorized to draw his warrant
 - 3 upon the treasurer for a sum not exceeding twenty-
 - 4 six hundred dollars annually, said sum to remain in
 - 5 the treasury subject to the drafts provided for in the
 - 6 second section of this act; the amount paid out upon
 - 7 said drafts, to be deducted annually from the income
 - 8 of the permanent school fund.
