STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND
FIFTY-NINE.

AN ACT to encourage Manufactures.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. All manufacturing establishments here-
2 after erected by incorporated companies, and all the
3 machinery and capital used for operating the same,
4 together with all such machinery hereafter put into
5 buildings already erected but not now occupied, and
6 all the capital used for operating the same, are ex-
7 empted from taxation for ten years after the passage
8 of this act.

SECT. 2. This act takes effect when approved.
