STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND FIFTY-NINE.

AN ACT to regulate the taking of fish on the coast of Maine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. That from and after the first day of May
- 2 next, it shall not be lawful for any person, not a resi-
- 3 dent of the State, to take fish of any description, with
- 4 seines, drift nets, or trolls, within the bounds herein
- 5 named, to wit: within one mile from the shore of
- 6 the main land, or of any and all islands of the State;
- 7 or upon any shoal within the jurisdiction of the State,
- 8 upon which, at low water, is less than twelve fathoms
- 9 of water, except as hereinafter provided.
- Sect. 2. No person, not a resident of this State,
- 2 shall be debared from the privilege of setting nets not

- 3 exceeding two hundred yards in length, and eight
- 4 yards in depth, to the stern of his or their vessel, or
- 5 to a mooring, for the purpose of taking bait to be used
- 6 in the ordinary business of cod fishing; but in no case
- 7 shall the bait so taken be salted and transported from
- 8 the State.
 - Sect. 3. Any net, more than two hundred yards in
- 2 length, or more than eight yards in depth, shall be
- 3 deemed a seine.
 - Sect. 4. Any line, upon which is fastened more
- 2 than two hooks, shall be deemed a troll.
- Sect. 5. Any vessel, not owned in the State, found
- 2 engaged in seining, netting or trolling, within the
- 3 limits above described, contrary to the provisions of
- 4 this law, shall forfeit all fish so taken, all seines, nets,
- 5 or trolls, found on board, and shall, for each offence,
- 6 forfeit the sum of one hundred dollars in money.
- Sect. 6. All fines and forfeitures which may be in-
- 2 curred for offences against this act, shall be one-half
- 3 to him or them who first sue for the same, and the
- 4 other half to the use of the common schools in the
- 5 town where such complainant or complainants reside,
- 6 and the said fines and forfeitures may be recovered by
- 7 action of debt or trespass, before any court competent
- 8 to try the same within the county where such offence
- 9 is committed.

SECT. 7. Any person or persons may seize such ves-2 sel, boat, craft, and apparatus of every kind employed 3 in unlawful fishery, and detain said property not 4 exceeding twenty-four hours, in order that it may be 5 attached and taken by due process of law, to satisfy 6 any judgment that may be recovered; but it shall, at 7 any time, be released on payment by the owner or 8 master, of the fine, costs and reasonable expenses.

Sect. 8. All laws inconsistent with the provisions 2 of this act are hereby repealed.
