REPORT

OF THE

JOINT COMMITTEE ON RULES AND ORDERS.

The Joint Committee on Rules and Orders, report the joint rules of the last Legislature, with the following additional:

RULE 13. Committees of conference shall consist of three members on the part of each House representing its vote, and their report, if agreed to by a majority of each committee, shall be made to the branch asking the conference, and may be either accepted or rejected; but no other action shall be had, except through a new Committee of Conference.

Rule 14. When any measure shall be finally rejected, it shall not be revived except by reconsideration; and no measure containing the same subject matter shall be introduced during the session, unless three days' notice is given to that branch of the Legislature of which the mover is a member.

The Committee would also recommend that Rule 13, of the Joint Rules and Orders, be changed to Rule 15.
