
#### STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-ONE.

AN ACT additional to chapter eighty-eight of the Revised Statutes, relating to partition of real estate.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. Whenever it shall appear from the
- 2 pleadings, that one or more respondents claim to be
- 3 seized of the whole of a specific parcel of the prem-
- 4 ises of which partition is prayed, such respondent or
- 5 respondents shall be entitled to a separate and inde-
- 6 pendent trial, and the jury shall pass upon such claim
- 7 without any other being submitted to them at the same
- 8 time for their determination.
- Sect. 2. This act shall take effect on its approval by the governor.
