STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and six of the revised statutes, relating to "the selection and service of jurors."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows :

SECTION 1. Chapter one hundred and six of the 2 revised statutes is hereby amended by striking out the 3 tenth section thereof, and inserting instead thereof the 4 following:

"SECT. 10. The sheriff, on receiving venires for 2 jurors, shall immediately send them to the constables 3 of the towns where directed; and each constable, on 4 receipt thereof, shall notify the inhabitants of the

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5 town qualified to vote for representatives, and espec-6 ially the municipal officers and town clerk, by posting 7 up notices in two public and conspicuous places in said 8 town, at least four days before such meeting, to as-9 semble and be present at the draft of the jurors called 10 for; which shall be six days at least before the sitting 11 of the court to which the venire is returnable."

SECT. 2. This act takes effect when approved by 2 the governor.
