STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-ONE.

AN ACT additional to chapter sixty-one of the revised statutes, relating to rights of married women.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. A married woman may bargain, sell and 2 convey her separate real and personal estate, enter 3 into any contracts in reference to the same, carry on 4 any trade or business, and perform any labor or services 5 on her sole and separate account, and sue and be sued 6 without the joinder of her husband, in all matters hav-7 ing relation to her separate property, business, trade, 8 services, labor and earnings; such contracts shall not

9 be binding on her husband, nor render him or his 10 property liable therefor, but she and her separate 11 property shall be liable for such contracts.

SECT. 2. Chapter sixty-one, section one, of the 2 revised statutes, is hereby amended by striking out 3 from the fourth line of said section the words "as if 4 sole and."

MARRIED WOMEN.

AMENDMENT

Offered by Mr. GOULD of Thomaston, to bill An act additional to chapter sixty-one of the revised statutes, relating to rights of married women.

Amend by striking out the first section, and inserting instead thereof the following:

SECTION 1. A married woman may make contracts 2 for the purchase, sale, care, improvement or manage-3 ment of real or personal estate, held, or to be held by 4 her, separate from her husband; and such contracts 5 may be enforced by or against her, and her separate 6 property, as if sole; but such contracts shall not be 7 binding on her husband, nor shall any married woman 8 be liable to arrest on mesne process or execution in 9 any civil suit.
