## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-ONE.

AN ACT relating to wills.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Section two of chapter sixty-four of 2 revised statutes is amended by adding the following at 3 the end thereof:

And when the last will of any deceased person, who 2 had his domicile in this state at the time of his death, 3 is lost, destroyed, suppressed, or carried out of the 4 state, and cannot be obtained after reasonable dili-5 gence, the execution and contents thereof may be 6 proved by a copy and the legal testimony of the sub-7 scribing witnesses to the will, or by any other compe-

8 tent evidence, as in case of a lost deed; and thereupon 9 letters testamentary shall be granted as on the last 10 will of the deceased, the same as if the original had 11 been produced and proved.

SECT. 2. Section thirteen of chapter sixty-five of 2 the revised statutes is amended by adding the follow-3 ing at the end thereof:

And in the settlement of any testate estate, where no 2 provision is made for the widow in the will of her hus-3 band, or she duly waives the same, the judge shall 4 make her suitable allowances from the personal estate, 5 from time to time, for the support of herself and family 6 under her care, during any litigation concerning the 7 will; and on the final probate of the will, he shall 8 make her a final reasonable allowance from the per-9 sonal estate; according to the degree and estate of 10 her husband, and the state of the family under her 11 care.

SECT. 3. This act shall take effect from and after 2 its approval by the governor.
