# STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-ONE.

AN ACT to promote and protect the navigation of Penobscot river for rafts of manufactured lumber.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. Whoever shall without the consent of 2 the owner take or carry away from the Penobscot river 3 between Oldtown falls and Bangor any board, joist, 4 clapboards, shingles, pickets, laths, or other manufac-5 tured lumber, with intent to convert the same to his 6 own use, is guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be 7 punished by fine not exceeding ten dollars, or by im-8 prisonment in the county jail not exceeding three

9 months, *provided* that nothing herein shall be so con-10 strued as to apply to the taking or carrying away any 11 drift wood or waste lumber.

SECT. 2. Any person or persons are hereby author-2 ized to build and maintain a dam or dams in or across 3 said river, for the purpose of improving the navigation 4 thereof for rafts of manufactured lumber, but no such 5 dam shall be erected to the injury of any mill or mill 6 privilege without the consent of the owner thereof, 7 *provided* that only mill owners or mill operators, or 8 persons engaged in the rafting and running such lum-9 ber shall be authorized to build or maintain such dam.

SECT. 3. If the parties concerned cannot agree upon 2 the compensation to be made to the owner of the land 3 on which such dam may be built, or which may be 4 flowed thereby, then the county commissioners of Pe-5 nobscot county, at the expense of the builders, shall, 6 on application of either party, determine the amount 7 to be paid therefor in the same manner and under the 8 same conditions and limitations as are by law provided 9 in cases of damage by the laying out of public high-10 ways.

SECT. 4. Any person who shall wilfully or inten-2 tionally tear down, destroy or injure any such dam 3 built under the provisions of this act, or shall cause 4 the same to be done, shall forfeit and pay a sum equal

5 to twice the amount of injury adjudged to be done, to 6 be recovered on complaint or indictment, according to 7 the aggravation of the offence, in any court competent 8 to try the same, and to be appropriated one-half to 9 repairing the injury so done, and the other half to the 10 use of the county.
