STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-ONE.

AN ACT to amend an act entitled "An act additional to an act to regulate the fisheries on the Kennebec river," approved April fourth, eighteen hundred fiftynine.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. No weir or other structure for the taking
- 2 of fish on the Kennebec river or its tributaries, shall
- 3 extend into more than ten feet of water at low-water,
- 4 provided a depth of ten feet exceeds a distance of one
- 5 hundred feet from low-water-mark at ordinary tides;
- 6 otherwise they may extend to a distance of one hun-

- 7 dred feet from said low-water-mark. But in no case
- 8 shall such weir or other structure occupy more than
- 9 one-eighth part of the width of the river whereon they 10 are built.
 - Sect. 2. The gate-way for the passage of fish shall
 - 2 be situated in the "pocket" of the weir, so called, and
 - 3 opposite the entrance thereto.
 - SECT. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent with
 - 2 the provisions of this act, are hereby repealed.
 - Sect. 4. This act shall take effect and be in force
 - 2 on and after its approval by the governor.
