STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SIXTY-ONE.

AN ACT to dispose of the public lands, and abolish the land office.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

SECTION 1. All the lands belonging to the state are 2 hereby given to the several counties in which said 3 lands lie; each county to have and hold all the public 4 lands therein located.

SECT. 2. Hereafter the state shall exercise no con-2 trol over the said lands; but the title to and control 3 over the same are hereby vested in the said several 4 counties.

SECT. 3. No act or resolve shall hereafter be passed 2 by the legislature, appropriating money for the build-3 ing or repair of any road or bridge, or for the support

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4 of schools, in any county, to which any of the afore-5 said lands are hereby ceded.

SECT. 4. On and after the first day of January, A. 2 D. eighteen hundred and sixty-two, the office of land 3 agent shall be abolished, and the property and papers 4 belonging to said office shall be transferred to the office 5 of state treasurer.
