STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SLXTY-ONE.

AN ACT additional to chapter ten of the revised statutes relating to the militia.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. The third section of chapter ten of the
- 2 revised statutes is amended by adding after the word
- 3 "invasion" in the third line thereof, the following:
- 4 "or to be mustered into the service of the United
- 5 States upon a requisition made upon the governor and
- 6 commander-in-chief, by the president thereof, in vir-
- 7 tue of the constitution and acts of congress."
 - Sect. 2. The sixth section of said chapter ten of the
- 2 revised statutes is amended by adding thereto the fol-
- 3 lowing: "and shall be subject to be mustered into

- 4 the service of the United States upon a requisition
- 5 made upon the governor and commander-in-chief by
- 6 the president of the United States, in virtue of the
- 7 constitution and acts of congress."
 - Sect. 3. When it shall become necessary to form
- 2 companies and regiments from the un-uniformed militia
- 3 by draft, elections for officers may be upon such notice
- 4 to the electors, less than ten days, as the officer order-
- 5 ing the election may direct.
- Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved 2 by the governor.
